

With your support, the Land Trust assisted Dane County with the purchase of 870 acres of land to create the new Walking Iron Natural Resource Area between Mazomanie Bottoms State Wildlife Area and Walking Iron County Park. This acquisition links the protected areas to create a 3,500-acre block of conservation land stretching 3.5 miles along the Wisconsin River.

We worked with the **Town of Dunn** and the Madison Retriever Club to place a conservation easement on 20 acres of land overlooking **Hook Lake State Wildlife Area**, protecting one of the highest-quality wetlands in Dane County.

At **Westport Drumlin State Natural Area** east of Waunakee, we purchased 73 acres of land to protect the eastern flank of a very high-quality prairie and improve public access to this important natural and educational resource.

Along **Token Creek**, we helped the Town of Windsor add 17 acres to its conservancy parks between Big Hill Nature Reserve,

Token Creek Conservancy, and a privately-owned parcel protected by a Land Trust conservation easement.

On the east side of Lake Wisconsin in Columbia County, we worked with a family to permanently protect the view of Wildcat Bluff, a sandstone bluff that rises above the water on a heavily-used section of the **Wisconsin River**. The 20-acre bluff has been owned by the family for 80 years.

Funding to protect these great places came from the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program, the Dane County Conservation Fund, the Town of Dunn, the Town of Windsor, the US Fish and Wildlife Service, Natural Heritage Land Trust members, and generous landowners.

Land Trust members learned about flood plain forest vegetation from UW botanist Ted Cochrane, Dane County Land Manager Doris Rusch, and JFNew Botanist Nicole Staskowski (all Land Trust members) during an April field trip to the new Walking Iron Natural Resource Area.

Between July 1, 2008 and June 30, 2009, the Land Trust received \$260,771 for operations and spent \$260,385 for operations.
