# Seed collecting

On seven Saturdays this fall DCNHF intern Sherrie Laier and volunteers from DCNHF and Madison Audubon collected over 100 gunny sacks filled with prairie seeds. Species collected include Rattlesnake Master, Canada Wild Rye, Yellow Cone Flower, Bee Balm, Indian Grass and several kinds of asters. The seed collecting is a cooperative venture between Madison Audubon Society and the Dane County Natural Heritage Foundation. Seeds collected will be planted at Goose Pond Sanctuary and the Wilke Preserve.

Volunteers will be needed throughout the winter to clean and prepare the seeds for spring planting. Special thanks to Boy Scout Troop 122 and Jeff Caves, as well as all the other volunteers who assisted us this fall collecting seed.






